GENERAL NOTICES

REGISTRATION AND DEPOSIT PAYMENTS: A registration fee of £100 is payable to register a pupil for entry. The registration fee is non-refundable. A deposit is payable prior to entry to confirm acceptance of the offer of a place. The deposit is deducted from the final term's account on leaving Downside. For UK and EU pupils, a deposit of £1,000 is required, and for all other pupils a full term's fees will be charged as the deposit.

TIER 4 VISA COMPLIANCE: Pupils joining Downside School who require a Tier 4 Visa receive specialist visa support. From this year onwards, these services are provided on the School's behalf by Newland Chase, a UK immigration law specialist (<https://newlandchase.com>). A fee of £600 will be charged for this service. The same size of fee (£600) will also apply to current pupils who need to renew their visas in order to remain at Downside for a further period of study. The fee for this specialist advice is in addition to the cost of the UK visa and any extra costs that a family may incur; for instance, through the use of an agent who may assist with the visa process in your home country. Downside School has taken the decision to employ the professional services of Newland Chase in order to protect families, pupils and the School and to provide the very best advice, given the increasingly complex environment surrounding immigration.

TRAVEL: Arrangements are in place to allow parents to make their own travel arrangements to and from school, which ensures greater transparency and efficiency in these matters. An update on travel protocols and procedures is sent out to parents each term.

EXTRAS: A threshold of £35.00 has been set for supplemental extras charges. Any items above this level shall be notified to parents in advance of charges on the termly fee bill.

INSURANCE: Parents are reminded that the School is unable to obtain insurance cover for clothing and personal effects; they are advised to arrange for an extension of their household policy if this does not already provide such cover. Insurance companies can provide special cover for a pupil's effects.

PRIVATE MEDICAL INSURANCE: Parents who advise the School of their child's private medical insurance cover, and later cancel it, must ensure that the School is immediately informed. It is not always possible for the School to contact parents before a medical appointment, particularly in an emergency, to confirm such cover and therefore any charges inadvertently incurred will be the responsibility of parents.

MONEY: Parents must ensure that their child's pocket money for the Term is provided. It is not possible for the School to advance cash or cheques on account.

ELECTRICAL SAFETY: Parents are requested to arrange that before the start of term the permitted electrical appliances which their child intends to bring into the School, have been PAT tested and found to be in safe and proper condition.

SPEED LIMIT: The layout of the School means that pedestrian and vehicle routes follow the same path. Therefore, the site speed limit is set at five (5) miles per hour. Parents are requested to observe this speed limit at all times in order to ensure the safety of pupils, staff and visitors.

MARKING OF CLOTHING: Parents are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure that clothing brought to the school is clearly marked with the pupil's surname and initials as this greatly assists with traceability through the School's laundry. Clothing purchased from the School Tailor during the course of any Term will be marked by the Tailor's staff.

DUVETS: Parents are reminded of the requirement to provide duvets for their child, as specified in the uniform list.

DAY PUPIL BUS: There are now three routes available: 1) Bath ↔ Downside 2) Frome ↔ Downside 3) Chew Valley ↔ Downside. In each case the fares will be split into journeys of five miles or less, or greater than five miles. Payable termly, the following fees apply:

- < 5 Miles £285 per term
- > 5 Miles £335 per term

Generous sibling discounts apply: 25% for each of two concurrent pupils; and 50% off for each of three or more concurrent pupils. Please contact Reception on 01761 235100 for more details.

MUSIC: A term's tuition per instrument will be £290 for nine lessons per term. Should a particular, specialised instrument involve a different cost basis this will be agreed in advance with parents.
