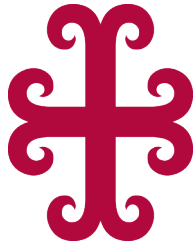

'May you live in interesting times!' is ascribed (incorrectly it turns out) to being a traditional Chinese curse, popularised in a speech made by Robert F. Kennedy to the National Union of South African Students in 1966. He went on to say, 'Like it or not we live in interesting times. Half a century has passed, but Kennedy would have no need to redraft his words if he were making his speech today, other than to assert the need for the creative energy of women alongside that of men. They are contributing their creative energy to building a better society.

As Clint Eastwood once said: 'There's a lot of great movies that have won the Academy Award, and a lot of great movies that haven't. You just do the best you can.'
